#### Notes From Administration – Mr. Gau

As an annual check-up on the education system, the Accountability Pillar Survey provides an opportunity for Alberta Education and school authorities to ensure that we are equipping students for success. The Accountability Pillar Survey uses a set of indicators consisting of results from surveys from students, parents and teachers around the quality

of education. Parents of students in grade 4, 7, and 10 should receive a survey from Alberta Education. You can also do the survey online by going to the link provided on our homepage (half way down, on the left) and using the random access code that was mailed out to you. In addition, students in these grades will also be completing these surveys online. All surveys are anonymous and ask questions about experiences at school. Participation in the survey helps to provide important information on the quality of education your child is receiving, so we encourage all stakeholders to participate in this opportunity. Survey results are usually available to school authorities in May and will be reported publicly as part of their 3-year Education Plan and Annual Results Report.

Before Christmas, we were studying the beauty of language and the art of communication. To kick off this week I asked the students to draw their favorite emoji. I had them write what they felt it means and had them pass it to their left / that person wrote what they thought it meant and so on around the circle. The students were surprised by how different each other's responses were. It was an exercise to deepen their understanding of language and how this new style of communication (emoji and text/messaging) can leave a lot of room for misinterpretations. We had a fun discussion about this and that whether they have something to communicate in school, work, family, or friends, how it is important to use the clearest form of communication by actually speaking in person whenever possible. Encouraging human connection, and when not an option - letting their written words be precise and intentional.
