Notes From Administration – by Mr. Chanasyk

It has been a wonderful start to the year and we are so thankful for a great school - great students, great staff, and a great community. Thank you to everyone who plays a role in making Bawlf School a great place to be every day!

Classes are into the swing of things and students are working hard on their studies. Several classes have been on field trips including our Biology 20 class to Miquelon Lake and the grade 3 & 4's to Camrose for the "What If" performance at the Peter Lougheed Performing Arts Centre. Volleyball for grades 4 and up is in the middle of its season. Cross Country Running had a full season and just wrapped up this past weekend. So many services are coming into the school to support students in the areas of speech, occupational/physical therapy, mental health, career counselling, educational technology, and the list goes on. Our staff has engaged in their first collaboration day, their first staff meeting, and are gearing up for their first professional learning day that is school based. Our Parent Council has had their first meeting and we've had many awesome hot lunches including the ham and egger lunch! So many wonderful things happening in our school!

We would like to thank everyone for participating in Orange Shirt Day on September 27th and raising awareness around truth and reconciliation and building positive relations.

On September 28th, our staff participated in our first Staff Collaboration Day of the year. We hosted Round Hill School staff and worked together on building understanding and lessons to support our students in developing awareness of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit. This time was supported by Mr. Kerry Laberge, our First Nations, Métis and Inuit Coordinator in Battle River School Division. In the afternoon, our secondary staff worked together with Mrs. Carla Praticante, our Career Counsellor, to collaborate on how to support students during and after high school! It was a very busy and productive day for all staff.

Several schools in Battle River School Division have student numbers or student needs that are different than what was expected when plans were put together last spring. At Bawlf School, we have ended up with some large numbers in the lower elementary grades and fewer students than expected in the Junior and Senior High. As a result, we have put classes together in English 30 and Math 30 to provide the extra support in the grade 1 and grade 3 class. We are very fortunate to have the supportive and experienced staff that we do to make these changes possible. Thank you for your patience as we implement our plan this week to ensure needs can be met for all students at Bawlf School. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact Mr. Gau or Mr. Chanasyk.

Report cards for Grades K-12 are set to go home on Monday, November 5th. Please keep in mind that the purpose of report cards are to provide effective communication of student learning as a means of improving student learning. These are followed up by Parent Teacher Interviews on Thursday, November 8th from 4 p.m.- 8 p.m. Kindergarten to grade six interviews are scheduled with the homeroom teacher and done in the homeroom classroom – please watch for information to be sent home around this. Grade seven to grade twelve interviews are held in the teacher's classrooms and are first come, first served. As much as possible, we try to keep interviews to ten minutes per student so that everyone has a chance to discuss with the teacher. If interviews need to go longer, a follow up conversation can be set up. While this time is set aside for teachers and parents to discuss successes and challenges, we hope that we have been communicating concerns prior to interviews, although this is not always easy or necessary. If you have questions or concerns, please let your child's teacher know.

Mothers Against Drunk Driving gave a presentation last week to our Grade 9-12's on the legalization of cannabis. It was a very informative presentation and we are thankful to MADD for providing the presentation. There is a new Administrative Procedure titled 165 - Tobacco, Alcohol and Drugs that states, "Division facilities and grounds are officially declared as zones free from the use, possession or offer for sale of tobacco, alcohol or drugs. Employees and students are also prohibited from attending work and/or school impaired from the use of alcohol or drugs."

We would ask parents to please remind students when they are being dropped off that they should be using the crosswalk only. In addition, when coming to the school to pick up students at the end of the day, please pull up as far as possible and hug the side lane while waiting for your child. Also please remind your children of appropriate dress for the cold weather in addition to our procedure of removal of wet or dirty shoes/boots upon entering the school. Students may be refused entry onto the bus if they are not dressed for the weather. We have also been asked to remind parents that permission must be granted by the bus drivers if your child wishes to ride a bus that is not part of their daily routine. Please contact the driver directly and provide a note to your student that has parent names and contact numbers, should they need to contact you in case of emergencies. Thank you in advance for your help around these issues. Also if you are requiring immediate assistance around transportation, the "after hours emergency number" is 1-844-773-2773 (1-844-773-BRSD).

Grade 9 students are once again participating in Take Our Kids to Work Day on Wednesday, November 14th! We are thankful to parents, families and community members who are willing to take students to work for a day! If you are able to provide an opportunity for a grade 9 student to join you at work, please let Mr. Chanasyk know.

Bawlf School and Battle River School Division are within Treaty 6 Territory. Treaties in Canada are between the Crown and signing First Nations and reflect the worldviews and understanding of identity of the signing peoples. This was assigned through a ceremonial and sacred agreement that incorporates the spirit and intent for treaties to last, "as long as the sun shines, the grass grows and the rivers flow."
