

BREAKFAST/HOT LUNCH PROGRAMS:

Thank you to everyone who participated in the survey that was sent out to all families. Council works hard on these programs and we appreciate the feedback and support with these. Thank you to all of the parent volunteers who have donated their time to help with hot lunches, muffin days and cereal mornings.

The Breakfast Program at Bawlf School, coordinated by School Council, provides a nutritious snack daily to ensure no child starts their day hungry. Many of our students have long bus rides and a quick snack before class provides the nutrition required to settle them into their first class and be ready to learn. This program is free of charge to the school community. It is open to all students. All people in need should have access. This program is a school council parent-run program with help from some staff and students. Any volunteers are encouraged to have a snack with the students as we feel that the positive social interaction with one another enhances the program. This program is made possible by the generous donations of school families and grant monies. Because we work with a limited budget and because we do receive grants we have to follow certain guidelines of what we can serve. We do try to accommodate all students. Special thank you to Superstore for the grant we received from PC Children's Charity to help offset costs for our program.

The Hot Lunch Program was formed in 2010 stemming from a request from high school students looking for alternative healthy, affordable hot lunch at the school. The program is a school council parent volunteer program that offers many delicious meals on a weekly basis to students and staff. The aim of the program is to provide this service to our school community at a reasonable cost to parents while at the same time generating some extra funds for the school. With changes to policy and parent concerns, we have lessened our homemade

hot lunches for the 2018-2019 school year. Next year we are looking to expand this but will need to prepare this food at the school. This will require many more volunteers and donations. From the survey we heard that the lunches are expensive, we do try to keep costs down as much as possible for all families. That being said costs from restaurants did increase this year, so we choose to make the program this year more about a service for families than a fundraiser. We hope to be able to keep the program within reasonable cost ranges.
