Thank you to everyone who attended and participated in our Remembrance Day Service which was held just before the November break. We were very fortunate to have our local Legion members take part in our service again this year. Thank you to Mrs. Barber for organizing this event and to all the students that took part in the reading of poems and special readings, in addition to our band students who played O Canada and another song of Remembrance.

Our scholastic book fair was a huge hit again this year. Thank you to all the students and parents that came out to support this event. The money raised will be used to purchase additional books and resources for our library (Learning Commons). Thank you Mrs. Kroetsch for your hard work, extra time and energy you gave in making this a huge success.

On Wednesday, November 21st, the High School Students Union led a pep rally to send our HS girls volleyball team off to Provincials. Best of luck in Bassano this weekend and know that we will be cheering for you! We also took this opportunity at our rally to acknowledge the successes of all our cross-country and volleyball athletes. Great job to all of our teams for a fantastic season. A reminder that next Friday, November 30th, there will be no school for students, as staff will be attending a school-based professional learning day. In addition, to this collaborative time, all staff will explore digital tools and apps to help support students and engage students in their learning. Staff will also continue to build upon their experience and foundational skills from the last PD day related to First Nation, Metis, and Inuit peoples. We are excited to have this time together, with the intention of supporting our staff and students around "Achieving Excellence" for all students.

November is also a time when much of our planning and goal setting for the current year has been completed. Our school's Three Year Plan and Annual Report was submitted to the Division this week. Staff worked collaboratively to determine strategies that would help reach our school division and school goals and they also determined what evidence will be used to ensure we have reached these goals. A draft copy of this plan was presented to school council this week and we look forward to any feedback that they provide to us. Our Administrative team will meet with Board and Division office members next month to present our plan and it will be available on our website in the near future for all stakeholders to see.

As we approach the holiday season, and amidst all the extracurricular activities that are scheduled, it is important that we maintain our focus on student achievement. We are asking that all parents that arrive at the school to please check in at the office and if you arrive at the end of the day to pick up your child, to please wait in the front waiting room next to our office. - The Grade 1, 4 and ECS had fun reading with flashlights. The ECS were great at spotting the letter "K". Thank you for sending in flashlights for us to use! Hopefully we can do more reading by flashlight in the future.
- The Grade 3 and 4 participated in the Camrose Kodiaks Read to Succeed program. Each student set a reading goal and have kept track of the books they have read over the past month.
