D.A.R.E. – **Grade 6** ~ My D.A.R.E. Report By: Megan Herder

Officer Mike has taught D.A.R.E. which means, Drug Abuse Resistance Education.



He has taught us for the last ten weeks, every Tuesday about eleven topics, but I'm going to talk about four topics. They are bullying, safe and responsible choices, handling stress, and peer pressure.

I have learned four types of bullying. The four types are Cyber Bullying, Physical Bullying, Verbal Bullying, and Social Bullying. Cyber Bullying is bullying, usually through social media or text messages. Physical bullying is physical contact such as punching or kicking. Verbal and Social bullying are similar because they can both use words to hurt another person. Social bullying is teasing others while Verbal bullying is saying hurtful words.

There is also ways to report bullying. You can tell a trusted adult by using the five w's. If you don't report it or do anything about it to help the victim you are a bystander. If you are afraid to report it, you can report it anonymously. Reporting anonymously can keep you safe from the bully, and in the case of a friend in the fight you won't lose friends either.

I have also learned about peer pressure. Peer pressure is when someone around your age is trying to get you to do something. Peer pressure can cause stress, fear, and even anger. You can avoid peer pressure by avoiding the situation, sticking in groups or never being alone around places where it might happen, walking away, saying no and giving an excuse, or you can change the subject. These are great ways to stay away or get out of peer pressure, because they can keep you safe.

In our D.A.R.E. classes we have also learned about making safe and responsible choices. You can make safe and responsible choices by using D.D.M.M. which we call Double Dare. You can use Double Dare to make safe and responsible choices by following the steps to good choices. First, you define the problem. Then, you assess your choices, and respond by picking one choice you have assessed. Lastly, you evaluate your choice. You ask yourself, "Was it safe?", "Was it responsible?", "Was it legal?", and "Was it healthy?" We can use this model to help make good choices.

My last topic I'm going to talk about is communication styles. There are four types of communication styles. They are confident, unsure, demanding, and nonverbal communication. Confident communication is acting in a way that others will respect you. Unsure communication is being uncertain or unwilling to stand up for yourself. Demanding communication is acting hostile and harming others without regards to their feelings. The last type of communication in nonverbal communication. Nonverbal communication is physical actions or body language that goes with what you are saying.

These topics are very important for daily life.

I have learned so many things in D.A.R.E. that will impact others. I have used D.A.R.E. to make great choices and handle stress. D.A.R.E. may seem just learning but we have lots of fun during class.
