Notes From Administration – *Mr. Chanasyk*

It has been a very busy, but a great start to the year and we are so thankful for a great school - great students, great staff, and a great community!

Classes are into the swing of things and students are working hard on their studies. Several classes have been on field trips including our Grade 4 class to Centra Cam and the Camrose Waste Management facility, Grades 1-6 Aquatic Pursuits at the Killam Pool, Grades 1-3 to the Jeanne and Peter Lougheed Centre for the performance of Axe Capoeira, and next week several classes are going to the Camrose Kodiaks Hockey Hooky event. Minislammer volleyball for grades 5 and 6 is in full swing and they have played several games already. Cross Country Running had a full season, and our Junior High girls varsity team and our Junior High and Senior High volleyball teams are getting close to playoffs. In addition, we had both Junior and Senior High golf teams competing in their local tournaments.

So many services are coming into the school to support students in the areas of speech, occupational/physical therapy, mental health, career counselling, educational technology, and the list goes on. Our Parent Council has had their first meeting and we've had many awesome hot lunches and will be enjoying our first ham and egger lunch this week! Many wonderful things happening in our school!

All of this doesn't happen without the support of great people. A big thank you to a supporter who generously donated our students can enjoy the Axe Capoeira performance. Thank you to our coaches (both staff and community!), bus drivers, parents for supporting and helping organize for hot lunches and the ham and egger lunch, our parents who have helped to run concessions at our tournaments, parents who have helped supervise on trips and I am sure there are more I have forgotten. To everyone supporting our school community, thank you!

We would like to thank everyone for participating in Orange Shirt Day on October 1st and for raising awareness around truth

and reconciliation and building positive relations. Also to all of our students and supporters for participating in the Terry Fox Run on September 25th. Bawlf School has been participating in this national event for over twenty five years and this year we raised \$3606.30 to raise awareness and funds for cancer research! Thank you for your support!

Kevin Sorenson came to talk to our Grade 6 class about government and he was kind enough to stay and talk with our Secondary grades as well about Parliament and his experience. We really appreciate the time he took to come and visit and for being willing to be put on the spot, thank you Kevin.

On October 11th, our staff participated in our first Staff Collaboration Day of the year. We gathered together to collaborate on how to support students to ensure they experience one years' worth of growth from where they were last year. Time is spent to review information we have on reading levels, math understanding and indicators such as attendance or wellness that helps us to know how to best support students. It was a very busy and productive day for all staff.

Our Division has been very cautious with spending since we have not received a budget yet. We do know that the Division has 100 students less this year, so we believe that this will affect budgeting greatly. With that said, we are working very hard with our class configurations and support to ensure needs can be met for all students at Bawlf School. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact Mr. Gau or Mr. Chanasyk.

Report cards for Grades K-12 are set to go home prior to interviews. Please keep in mind that the purpose of report cards are to provide effective communication of student learning as a means of improving student learning. These are followed up by Parent Teacher Interviews on Wednesday, November 6th. Kindergarten to grade six interviews are scheduled with the homeroom teacher and done in the homeroom classroom please watch for information to be sent home around this. Grade seven to grade twelve interviews are held in the teacher's classrooms and are first come, first served. As much as possible, we try to keep interviews to ten minutes per student so that everyone has a chance to discuss with the teacher. If interviews need to go longer, a follow up conversation can be set up. While this time is set aside for teachers and parents to discuss successes and challenges, we hope that we have been communicating concerns prior to interviews, although this is not always easy or necessary. If you have questions or concerns, please let your child's teacher know.

We would ask parents to please remind students when they are being dropped off that they should be using the crosswalk only. In addition, when coming to the school to pick up students at the end of the day, please pull up as far as possible and hug the side lane while waiting for your child. Also please remind your children of appropriate dress for the cold weather in addition to our procedure of removal of wet or dirty shoes/boots upon entering the school. Students may be refused entry onto the bus

if they are not dressed for the weather. We have also been asked to remind parents that permission must be granted by the bus drivers if your child wishes to ride a bus that is not part of their daily routine. Please contact the driver directly and provide a note to your student that has parent names and contact numbers, should they need to contact you in case of emergencies. Thank you in advance for your help around these issues. Also if you are requiring immediate assistance around transportation, the "after hours emergency number" is 1-844-773-2773 (1-844-773-BRSD).

Grade 9 students are once again participating in Take Our Kids to Work Day on Wednesday, November 6th! We are thankful to parents, families and community members who are willing to take students to work for a day! If you are able to provide an opportunity for a grade 9 student to join you at work, please let Mr. Chanasyk know.
