School Fees ~ All Term 4 fees have been applied to all students online accounts that the fees apply to (all Junior High student for the Complex fees in Camrose, all High School Art and Food Studies). All fees will be printed off and sent home shortly.

Kindergarten Registrations now accepted for 2022-2023 ~ Kindergarten is designed for children who will be five years of age on or before December 31, 2022. Mrs. Thomsen, our Kindergarten teacher, along with members of our school division team will be having a Success Starts Early orientation event for all pre-registered Kindergarten students on May 18th.

This is designed to help new Kindergarten students become familiar with the school prior to the beginning of the school year and give our team a chance to see the new students and screen for services.

We are also accepting registrations for any students that will be new to Bawlf School for the 2022-2023 school year, Grades One-Twelve.
