- **Career Counselling** ~ Attention Grade 12's attending post-secondary in the fall If you require student loans, the 2022-2023 application will be available online through Alberta Student Aid in late June. Don't forget Rutherford Scholarships you can apply after August 1st once you are accepted and your final marks are available. Remember, if you plan to attend post-secondary at a later time (ie: years from now), you can still apply for Rutherford. Everyone should apply as you may be surprised! Please contact your career counsellor if you require support.
- Young Medical Minds ~ Young Medical Minds is a partnership of local medical professionals, Alberta Health Services, Covenant Health and the Augustana Campus of the University of Alberta. This program is a free, six week course developed to provide grade 8 students with the opportunity to experience hands-on exposure to various aspects of the medical field. Your child will attend this extra-curricular course one evening per week for 6 weeks. The course will take a medical scenario that is relevant to the students and follow it through the medical system. Each night will highlight health promotion and medical management.
