It is hard to believe that November has arrived. Staff and students have settled into established routines and are working hard in their learning. We have enjoyed beautiful weather thus far, but we know colder temperatures are just around the corner. Thank you to those parents that took the time to connect with teachers in person or on the phone during parent - teacher interviews.

The Bawlf Awards program took place on October 7th, as we acknowledged both past and present students' achievements. Many were in attendance to receive and to celebrate award recipients. We are very proud to be able to celebrate the achievements of our students. Thank you to our community sponsors for their continued support of this program.

Volleyball teams are nearing the end of some very successful seasons. The HS boys and girls are currently sitting in 1st place as league play wraps up. Also to all of our students and supporters for participating in the Terry Fox Run on September 20th. We gathered together to collaborate on how to support students to ensure they experience 1 years worth of growth from where they were last year.
