Whigh School Girls Basketball ~ *by Shaye Flemming* ~ The High School girl's basketball team just finished another memorable season with some significant accomplishments. They were undefeated in the league and won four out of the five regular-season tournaments they competed in. One of these wins included a 4A tournament at Archbishop Macdonald High School in Edmonton. This win was quite a shock to many Edmontonians who were unaware of Bawlf's existence. The team then competed strongly at Zones, winning the title against the CACHS Knights. This victory kept their season alive, and they got to ride a coach bus alongside the boy's team to compete in the Village of Stirling for 1A provincials. The girls made many memories on and off the court, which resulted in a 4th place finish. The team is excited about next season and will miss the four departing Grade 12 athletes.

Wildcat players switched gears and took to the basketball court. Our boys had a great season winning the Lloyd Sather and Pastor Charlton tournaments plus were finalists at the Drumheller DVSS Sr Invitational. The Wildcats also placed 3rd of 16 teams at the Central Alberta Quint tournament and took 3rd at the Claresholm WCCHS Cobra Classic tournament. The Cats went undefeated in league play and took the silver medal at the Central Alberta Zone championships held in Bawlf. Because our Central zone had the #2 provincially ranked team (Consort) and the 5th ranked team (Bawlf), both teams would qualify for the 3 day Provincial Tournament hosted by Coaldale Christian School.

Our first match at provincials was against Taber Christian. We took the lead early and never gave it up, winning by 20pts. Our second game was against Olds Koinonia Christian, a team we lost to by 30pts seven weeks earlier. We came out strong, a see-saw battle ensued but unfortunately in the end, Olds made a few critical shots at the right time and we did not. The 12pt loss would send us to the consolation side against the Picture Butte Dragons. Our boys held the lead the entire game and although the Dragons tied the game in the 4th quarter, the Cats made some clutch shots and won by 5. The Consolation final would be a rematch against the #2 ranked Consort Cobras. The boys stuck to the game plan, were playing great, built a 6 point lead only to give it up and be down by 2 at the half. After a hard fought game and tremendous effort, we came up a bit short losing 77-67. Being in the top 6 teams out of 83 in the province is still a great achievement especially in 1A boys basketball.

I could not be prouder of these guys; how hard they worked at practice all season, how they fought to the end of each game, the great defense they played, and how they carried themselves as athletes on and off the court. They certainly have built some life-long friendships but also further developed many skills needed to be successful in life. Well done!

Thank you to all the parents for their support throughout the season but especially their work making the concession so successful for both the Quint tournament and the zone tournament.
