The girls worked hard throughout February- battling various injuries, being busy with other sports or drama productions, and somehow managing to fit school work in the mix! We finished 3rd of 16 teams at the Quint Tournament at the beginning of Feb and took second place at the Pastor Charlton tournament in Hay Lakes at the end of Feb. We finished first in our league as we headed to Zones in Eckville on March 8/9. We battled hard at Zones and came away with a bronze medal; defeating Daysland in the final match to earn a berth to Provincials. The Cats went into Provincials ranked 6th (our Central Zone was a very tough competitive Zone and the 3 teams we sent to Provincials were ranked 3, 5 and 6). Our first game was against Pincher Creek and after a slightly slow start, we finished strong and came away with a 59-50 win. The win put us in the quarter finals against Hay Lakes later that night and our Wildcats came out strong and controlled the pace of the game from start to finish and ended with a decisive 48-31 win. In the semi final, we came up against a strong #2 ranked team from Olds Koinonia and even though we were only down by 2 at the half, we couldn't hold on and ended up losing by 18. The final game of the season- the bronze medal match, was an intense back and forth game against Hines Creek (a team from way up north that had players from 4 high schools combined to make one team). Although we came up just short with a 2 point loss, our season was still a major success finishing 4th in 1A Girls. We would like to thank all the parents, teachers, students and community members who followed our journey to Provincials and for all the kind words of encouragement and congratulations along the way. We also say goodbye to our graduating players- Jaidan Burnstad, Shelby Hafso and Makenzie Bratrud and wish them good luck in their future endeavors.

In addition, congratulations to Devyn Rasmuson for winning the "1A Rookie of the Year" at a Shooting Stars All Star event in Calgary last weekend! Wow! We are very proud of you, Devyn!
