Dear Wildcat Families,

As we wrap up the first month, I want to extend a heartfelt thank you to our students for their incredible respect and cooperation as they navigate the cell phone and late assignment policies. Your dedication to these expectations has been fantastic, and we are proud of how smoothly the transition has gone.

A huge shout-out also goes to our hardworking teachers, who have been tireless in their support of our students. Whether it's in class, coaching, during Block 5 support sessions, or just providing extra help when needed, our staff has gone above and beyond to ensure everyone is thriving academically. Thank you for your dedication and commitment!

We also had an amazing turnout at our recent School Council meeting; we are so grateful to our parents for your continued support of Bawlf School. Your involvement and partnership mean the world to us, and we look forward to more opportunities to collaborate with you throughout the year.

One of the highlights of the summer was the construction of a **hibernaculum** on school grounds to help relocate local snakes. Our Grade 2 class has taken on the important task of conducting research for the Alberta Government by trapping and documenting the snake population. Our students have been busy monitoring 25 traps, and so far, our biggest snake day resulted in an exciting capture of 43 snakes! Mrs. Matthew, along with some Grade 2 students, will present this unique project at the BRSD head office next month. It's a hands-on learning experience that we're incredibly proud of!

Another wonderful initiative is our **Community Volunteerism** options class for high school students, led by Mrs. Gjesdal. The class has been actively reaching out to our local community to offer help where needed, and the response has been overwhelmingly positive. Students have already assisted with landscaping, painting, hauling garbage, and fixing the gaga pit (which got a bit of a

wild ride in the summer windstorm!). They've also been supporting fellow students within the school, showing leadership and generosity in action.

Lastly, our Junior High and Senior High Block 5 classes have been going exceptionally well. Students needing extra time to finish homework or receive additional support have made great use of this period, and teachers have been available to answer questions and provide guidance.

Thank you all for making this a wonderful start to the school year. We are incredibly proud of our Wildcats and look forward to what's next!

When you purchase gift cards, which are spent like cash, a rebate goes back to our group automatically. There is no additional cost to you. When you order \$150 in gift cards, you pay \$150 and you get gift cards worth \$150! It's that simple. Over 100 retailers are offering rebates back to our group! It is quite simple to sign up for the Online program. You can sign up on the website www.fundscrip.com. I have included a Quick Start Guide in the attachments.

Our Invitation code is UDJFXB. You can pay for your gift cards by EFT, Online Bill Payment Service, or Credit Card (donations reduced by 1.99%), and they can be shipped directly to you.
