In 1993, Franklin Graham received a call for a man overseas in England. The man asked if Franklin would be able to fill shoeboxes, full of gifts for children from war-torn Bosnia.

Franklin agreed but Christmas was still months away, and he forgot. Franklin received a call around Thanksgiving where the man checked in with how the gifts were going. Franklin asked his friend Pastor Ross Rhoads of Calvary Church of Charlotte for help. A Sunday shortly after Rhoads spread the word on how to fill the shoe boxes. Within weeks over 11,000 boxes were filled.

Ever since Samaritan's Purse has been collecting shoes boxes filled with school supplies, toys, and hygiene items for children around the world.

These three athletes advanced to the Provincial Race in Grande Prairie. They were competing against about 115 athletes in each of their races, with 1A to 4A schools from all over Alberta. All 3 of these athletes had fast times and brought home the 1A School Team Provincial Championship! This was also the first time that Bawlf School has achieved this award. Jhett finished 21st, Blayze finished 32nd, and Kate earned a spot on the podium with a 10th place finish. Way to go, Wildcats!
