Dear Wildcat families,

March has been a busy and exciting month at Bawlf School. The ever-changing weather has kept us on our toes, but inside our walls, we've remained focused on *Achieving Excellence*. Here are a few highlights from the past few weeks.

We were privileged to welcome Chris Gray, also known as Cody Deaner in the wrestling world, to speak to our Grade 7-12 students. His inspiring message emphasized the power of influence and the importance of hard work in achieving success.
